In the process, by winning the silver medal, CAN (W) qualified for Paris with the men's qualifier yet to be announced.

Whilst there, together with Lori Okimura, Louise Ashcroft and Glenn Stewart, I had the honour of meeting with The General Syndicate of Sports Professions with whom I later signed an MoU for cooperation on matters such as education and research.

2023 SITTING VOLLEYBALL ZONE CHAMPIONSHIPS



The 2023 ParaVolley Pan America (PVPA) Zone Championships were held earlier in the year in Edmonton, Canada with Brazil (men) and USA (women) winning gold and qualifying for Paris 2024.

The 2023 ParaVolley Asia Oceania (PVAO) Zone Championships were held in Almaty, Kazakhstan who hosted this event for the very first time with KAZ (men) and CHN (women) qualifying for Paris 2024.

The gold medals were won by IRI

(men – who had already qualified for Paris) and CHN (women).

It was historic that KAZ were able to deliver such an event as host and hopefully do so again in the future.

EUROPEAN SITTING VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONSHIP MEN & WOMEN CAORLE 2023

The 2023 ParaVolley Europe (PVE) Zone Championships were successfully delivered in Caorle, Italy with Bosnia & Herzegovina (M) and Italy (W) claiming the coveted places in the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games by winning gold.

The men's final was extremely close with Germany taking BIH to

5 sets and ITA (W) defeated SLO (W) 3 sets to 1.

The event began with a colourful parade in the streets of the ancient city of Caorle that everyone enjoyed.

PVA SITTING VOLLEYBALL ZONE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Due to insurmountable difficulties, including the inability to attach the event to the African Para Games, ParaVolley Africa has rescheduled the Zone Championships from 2023 to early 2024 with the event to proceed in Lagos, Nigeria from 29 January to 3 February 2024.

STRATEGIC PLANNING IN LA

With incredible planning from General Manager Phil Allen and Vice President Lori Okimura, and professional facilitating from Wayne Hellquist (WPV Life Member) and Gary Moy (USA) the Strategic Planning event of 3 days was truly inspirational. Apart from the Board Members, we had several "Thought Leaders" who were invited to specifically add additional minds to the challenge.

The focus was on the upcoming 4-5 years, but based on some of our recent history, I took the opportunity to show how remarkable World ParaVolley is as an international federation that is largely (99%) volunteer driven.

It was especially pleasing to note the leadership roles undertaken by our two athlete representatives, Nicky Nieves and Heidi Peters.







STRATEGIC PLANNING IN LA

One major vison was for both sitting volleyball and standing beach paravolley to be included in the 2032 Brisbane Paralympic Games.

More will follow about the Strategic Planning meeting as we look forward to writing up the Plan and begin implementation in 2024.





Following the Strategic Planning meeting, Vice President Lori Okimura used her incredible connections and networks to enable her, Phil Allen and me to meet with several organisations located in LA, the site of the 2028 Paralympic Games.

We first visited the campus of the University of Southern California (USC) and inspected their volleyball and beach volleyball facilities, concluding that surely in the future, this would be a great

future competition venue and Development Centre.

Then we visited the famous Manhattan Beach to evaluate the possibility of holding a Standing Beach ParaVolley event there in 2024 and beyond.

This was followed the next day with a visit to the Sport Department of the LA28 Organising Committee – we were the first Paralympic IF to organise such a visit with the Sport Department - a great "first" to have!

Discussions ensued about the needs of the sitting volleyball competition that will prove beneficial to our athletes in the future.

Next in the list was LA84, the foundation legacy organisation from the 1984 LA Olympic Games that may be able to assist us with a history project.

Finally, we visited Santa Monica Beach, the site of the FIVB Beach Volleyball competition in 2028 – this is a great choice by the FIVB and the Games Organising Committee – so historical and iconic.







WORLD ABILITYSPORT MOU

At the IPC meeting in Bahrain, Vice President Lori Okimura facilitated the MoU signing between World ParaVolley and <u>World Abilitysport</u> that will provide our athletes greater competition opportunities, including in particular, the Guttmann Games that will enable

the participation of the standing beach paravolley discipline athletes.

Whilst in Bahrain, Lori proactively met with the officials from other organisations – all of which add to our ongoing relationship development that enhances our reputation.

One meeting in particular has seen ongoing membership and hosting opportunities developed with Bahrain NPC.

GENERAL SYNDICATE OF SPORTS PROFESSIONS - EGYPT

The Board has approved the signing of an MoU with the Syndicate, that will enable the two organisations to cooperate on education and research.

I was pleased to be able to sign the MoU in LA at the famous SoFi stadium, the site for the 2028 Paralympic Games Opening Ceremony.

The Syndicate is made up of academics from approximately 28 Egyptian universities and have a strong focus on physical education, sport, education and research.

PARIS 2024 PARALYMPIC **GAMES SITTING VOLLEYBALL FINAL QUALIFIERS**

After an open bid process, the **Board has approved China to host** the two final qualifiers for Paris 2024 (men and women) in the beautiful city of Dali, Yannan **Province**.

Mr Weiping Tu OAM has been appointed by the Board as the **Technical Delegate due to his** wealth of experience and critical connections with China.



The competition dates are 3 to 10 **April 2024 and it is anticipated** that there will be up to 16 teams competing for the final two places the sitting volleyball in competition in Paris next year.

2024 AWARD NOMINATIONS

To date, the International World ParaVolley Day awards have been given 3 times and we are seeking nominations for the 2024 awards.
